


New partners !

Follow our ongoing lemur research project and find out about the survey and the tools put in place by our team for estimating the population density of the lemurs on Anjouan.



A positive future for fishing on Anjouan

The majority of Comorians rely on fishing for their protein intake – and this is in spite of serious difficulties: fickle nature, unstable markets and insufficient infrastructure. It is in this context that Dahari has launched a new initiative in partnership with the UK NGO Blue Ventures to secure the sustainability of fishing and the revenues it generates, as well as the conservation of marine biodiversity.
